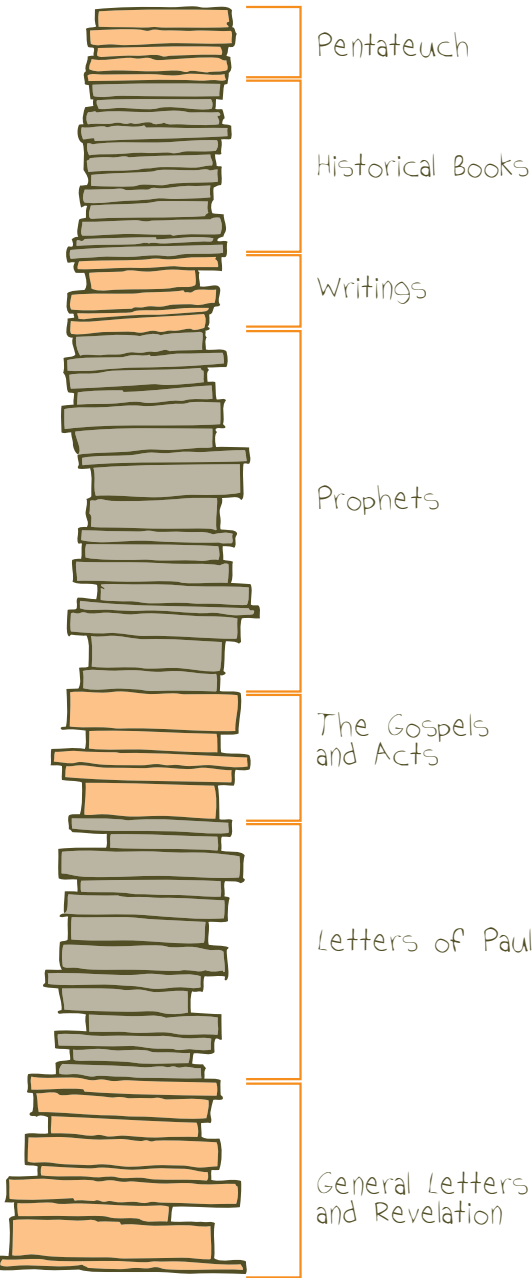

Did you know that the Bible isn't really one book? It's actually 66 books all bound together. Some of the books are only a page long.

The 66 books can be divided into seven sections: Pentateuch, Historical Books, Writings, Prophets, The Gospels and Acts, Letters of Paul, and General Letters and Revelation.

The Bible also divides into two testaments, called the Old Testament and the New Testament. You can remember this and how many books each has by using the simple formula of 39.

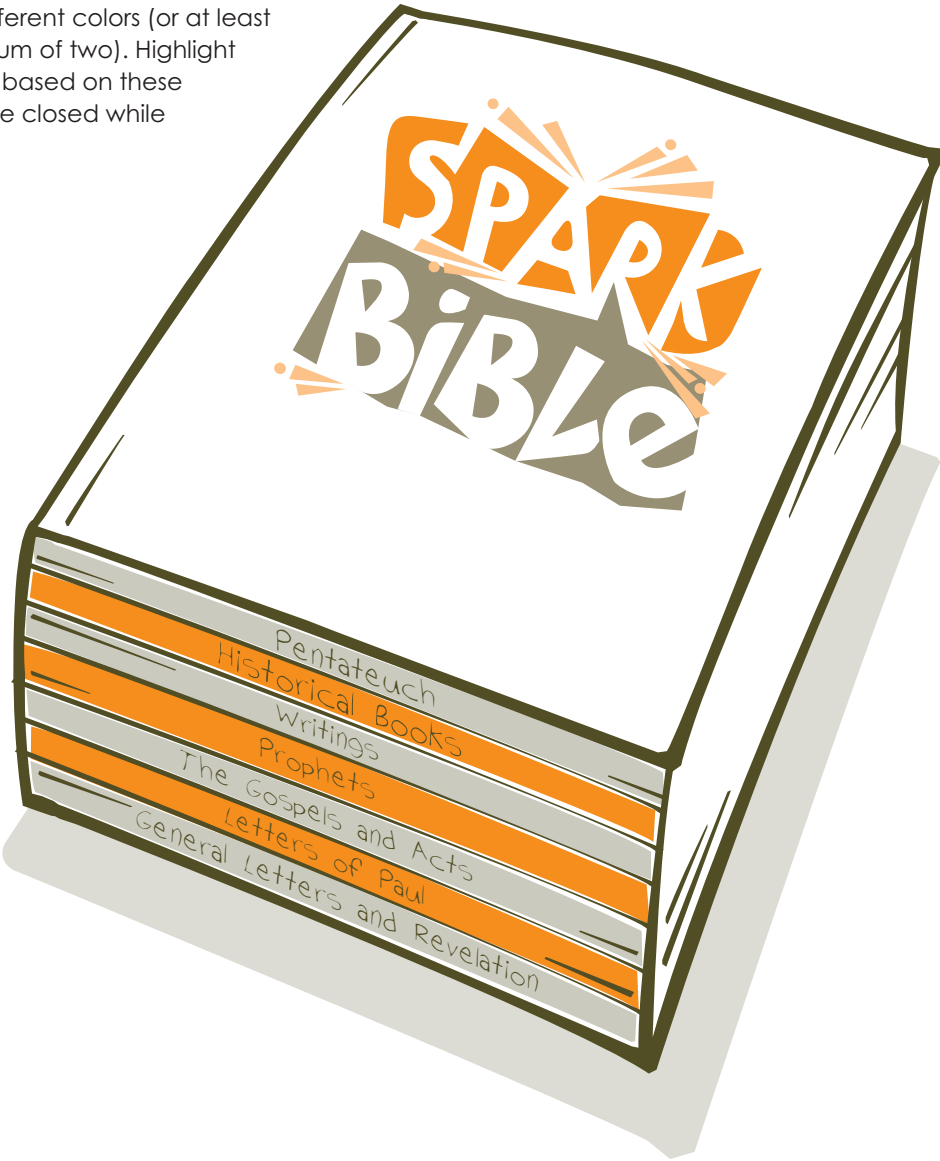

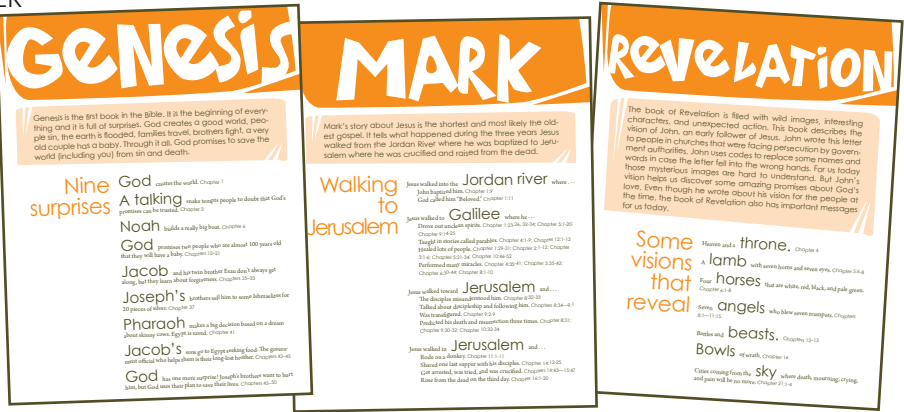

Every book has a one-page introduction. Read those to decide which book to read first.



TIPS FOR LOOKING UP BIBLE VERSES

- 1 The first verse in any chapter usually doesn't have a 1. Instead, the big number shows that you're starting with the first verse of a new chapter.
- 2 If you're not sure where to find the book of the Bible, use the Table of Contents on pages iii–v to help you.
- 3 Sometimes Bible verses are called a passage, a text, a reference, or a citation. No matter what word is used, you'll be looking up verses in the same way.
- 4 Sometimes the name of a Bible book includes a number, like 2 Samuel, 1 Corinthians, or 3 John.
- 5 If you see a short dash between verse numbers, this means that there is more than one verse. The number before the dash tells you where to start and the number after the dash tells you where to end.
- 6 If you see a long dash between chapter numbers, this means that the verses go across more than one chapter.
- 7 A few books in the Bible are so short that they only have one chapter! In those books, only the verse numbers are shown.

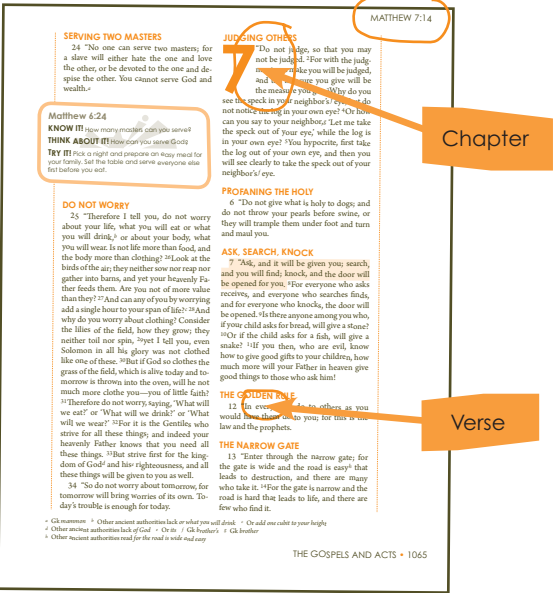
When you want to look up verses in your Bible, there are three parts to check. A word or words before the number, a number before the colon, and one or more numbers after the colon.

MATTHEW 7:12

The **WORD** tells you the book of the Bible where you'll find the verse.

The number **BEFORE THE COLON** tells you the chapter. (Those are the big numbers in your Bible.)

The number **AFTER THE COLON** tells you the verse. (Those are the little numbers in your Bible.)

JOHN

The Gospel of John doesn't include Jesus' birth story, but you will find some long speeches and long prayers and long descriptions. John's Gospel gets you thinking. In the end (see Chapter 20:30-31), John wants you to believe in Jesus. Everything in this book can help you live a life as a believer. Knowing this, you can read the signs in this book that direct you toward belief in Jesus.

Changing water to wine. From the first night out in his ministry, Jesus demonstrated amazing power. Chapter 2:1-12

Healing a royal official's son. Jesus didn't only work miracles on his faithful followers. Chapter 4:43-54

Healing a paralyzed man. Jesus could just say the word, and the man stood up and walked. Chapter 5:1-15

Feeding 5000 (or more). They were hungry, and Jesus fed them. Chapter 6:1-15

Walking on water. Jesus presented evidence of power over all things when he walked on water. Chapter 6:16-24

Healing a man born blind. Some people wanted to blame a man's blindness on sin. Jesus made him see so that everyone would know God's power beats sin any day. Chapter 9:1-12

Raising Lazarus from the dead. But this sign also inspired religious leaders to plot to kill Jesus. Chapter 11:1-53

SPIRITUAL BLINDNESS

35 Jesus heard that they had driven him out, and when he found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"^a 36 He answered, "And who is he, sir?"^b Tell me, so that I may believe in him." 37 Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." 38 He said, "Lord,^b I believe." JESUS THE GOOD SHEPHERD

10 "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. 2 The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. 3 The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. 4 When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. 5 They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." 6 Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

7 So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. 8 All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. 9 I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. 10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

11 "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

12 The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. 13 The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. 14 I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, 15 just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. 16 I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. 17 For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it
